

MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER - MR CLINTON

Happy Easter to all our pupils, parents, staff, governors and friends of ABI!!

In terms of the liturgical calendar, Easter is the most important time for Catholics. It is the foundation of our faith. As I was saying to my Year Ils this morning, the events that took place at the Last Supper are reenacted in every single mass across the globe every day. On what we now called Maundy Thursday, Jesus broke the bread and said the sacred words, "Take this, all of you, and eat it, for this is my body, which will be given up for you." On Good Friday, Jesus was put to death and on the third day, Sunday, he rose from the dead and absolved our sins and Christianity was born. These days are called 'The Passion of Christ' and an incredible production of this took place at St Thomas Aquinas Catholic School last night. For the first time, pupils from five Catholic secondary schools joined together and through a combination of music, dance, drama and scripture wowed its audience which contained proud family members, Bishop David, representatives from the Diocese and staff from all five schools. Thank you Ms Jones and well done pupils! This is the not the last time the five schools will work together. As well as traveling to Lourdes in France over Easter together, Sixth Formers from the five schools will travel to Cambodia and Nepal in June and July, as part of the Turing Programme.

This was to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the St Patrick's Day Parade that takes place in Digbeth. Archbishop Ilsley has an enviable tradition of being a very active member of the parade. CATHOLIC LIFE THE GOSPEL - JOHN 12:20-23

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them: 'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. I tell you, most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies, it yields a rich harvest. Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life. If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled. What shall I say: Father, save me from this hour? But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours. 'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.' By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.

What does this mean for us?

This is a challenging passage. Jesus is telling his followers that he is going to die for them. Understanding why Jesus' death was necessary takes time for Christians. This week is a good time to reflect on this and the need to make sacrifices, the need to atone for what we do wrong and the need to be hopeful that evil can be overcome by good.

This Lent we have focused on supporting two key charities: The Columban Missions and St Chad's Sanctuary. Our Catholic Life reps took part in a workshop and online zoom to Fr Kurt in Myanmar to learn about the education centre he has set up for disadvantaged young people who cannot access education due to poverty. As a result the pupils chose to fundraise with a 'wear your trainers to school day' with pupils bringing in a donation for the education centre.


Our Minnie Vinnie group also took part in the 'Lift the Ban' campaign led by the Columban Missions. They listened to the experiences shared by some Asylum Seekers and then went into Acocks Green to collect signatures which will be presented to our local MP to lift the ban on paid work for Asylum Seekers.

As a whole school, we have collected toiletries, clothes and food for St Chad's Sanctuary. A team of our Catholic Life reps attended a tour of St Chad's Sanctuary and then launched the campaign. The response has been humbling; we have filled two minibuses with donations from pupils and staff. St Chad's Sanctuary led a live assembly with all pupils and students on March 8th and talked about where the first minibus load of donations would be going. Thankyou so much to all the families who have been so generous in your donations. This is Catholic Social Teaching in action!

Deacon Tim, Fr Marco and a host of visiting priests led services of reconciliation with each year group followed by the opportunity to receive the sacrament of confession. 145 pupils and students chose to receive this sacrament! It is so important for us to stop and reflect, so we can grow as human beings. We have also introduced an end of the day prayer during Lent so the pupils end the day by thanking God for their day, their friends and their family.

Finally, on Thursday 21st March, 10 pupils took part in the 'Born For This' production at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic School. We joined with pupils and teachers from Bishop Challoner, John Henry Newman, St Peter's and St Thomas Aquinas on this joint performing arts production. Born for This is a moving and powerful depiction of the Stations of the Cross in words, music and drama and therefore provided a variety of opportunities for our pupils with different talents and abilities. Pupils and staff spent the day rehearsing and then performed the show in the evening to a packed audience. It was a very powerful and moving production with so much talent on show. Our pupils were fantastic!
