Tracksuit tops – are not allowed. There seems to a current trend in Birmingham schools of wearing Nike Tech Fleeces to school. These are expensive so keep them safe at home and save them for wearing at the weekend.

Tights for girls and no socks – all girls must wear tights. Socks <u>should not</u> be worn over the tights. Again, a recent trend is for a very small number of girls to wear sports sock over their tights. This was recently debated at our parent consultation which took place on Wednesday 3rd July. I have taken these points on board but no change will be made this academic year. Girls are welcome to wear trousers but they should be aware of the guidance below.

Trousers – trousers should be the usual standard fit. They should not be skinny fit, 'jeggings style'. Parents with daughters should be particularly aware of this if they go uniform shopping. Socks, of course, can be worn with trousers. They should be plain black or navy blue – sports socks are not permitted.

Other items that are not permitted include small pouch size bags. In addition, energy drinks and fizzy drinks are not permitted on the school site.

Please be aware that parents may be contacted if pupils are not wearing the correct uniform. In some cases, children may be sent home.

Reminder about mobile phones

All mobile phones should be switched off and kept in pupils' bags between 8:45 and 15:15. It would be greatly appreciated if parents did not contact their child during the school day on their mobile phone.
