



The 7 Formal Elements of Art

Space - includes background, foreground and middle ground

Form - a three-dimensional geometric figure or shape

Shape - a two dimensional geometric form

Line - a continuous mark,

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Colour - produced when light strikes an object and reflects back to the eye.
- Hue: name we give to colours i.e. red, yellow, blue.
- Intensity: brightness and vividness of colour

Texture - how an object feels when touched, or visually 'feels' through marking or patterns

Tone (or Value) - the lightness or darkness of colour or shaded tone.
