



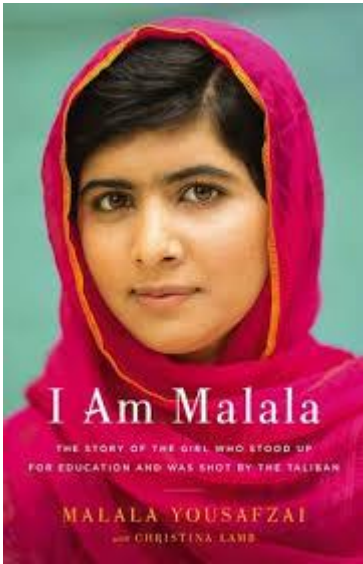
Assessment Points

PAR 1: you will be asked to write a persuasive argument using persuasive techniques, punctuation, ambitious vocabulary.

AAFPOL 2: you will complete a poetry comparison literature question on two poems you have already studied. You will also write a persuasive response to a statement using persuasive techniques, ambitious vocabulary, punctuation and paragraphs.

- You will analyse the use of dramatic techniques.

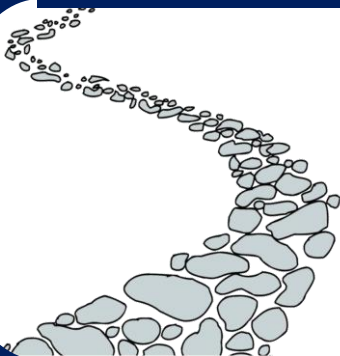


Assessment Points

PAR 1: Literature extract on setting: identifying the atmosphere; using quotes; analysing writer’s techniques; linking to context.

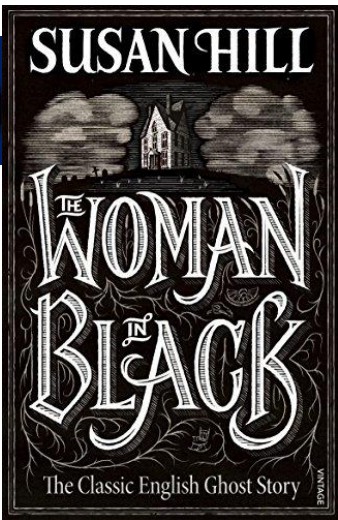
PAR 2: language based writing task focusing on persuasive language techniques, vocabulary, paragraphing, spelling, and punctuation.
