In A Level Geography

you should....

After each lesson

- Complete homework set during the lesson - check your diary and google classroom for this (this will include Seneca homework).
- Re-read material from the lesson and highlight key terminology/concepts.
- Prepare a list of questions to ask your teacher based on any misconceptions.

Every week

- Spend some time reading around the topic using the library resources and any sources online.
- Ensure you have updated revision notes – Flashcard, keyword definitions.
- Test your knowledge of key terminology, concepts and ideas.

Every term

- Spend time going back to the start of topics and consolidate your notes and create revision materials.
- Complete some 6 and 20 markers using the past papers on the AQA website. Self or peer assess using the mark scheme and indicative content.
- Create a working spider diagram where you can map out the synoptic links between each topic.

Throughout the year

- Revisit previously learned topics more than once.
- Read examiners reports to learn top tips for the exams.
- Learn how to identify and explain connections between topics covered (AO2)
- Complete 6 markers which require you to analyse (AO3).
- Create flash cards and test yourself regularly. Revisit any cards that you got wrong until you get them right (AO1/AO2).
- Redraft exam answers in green pen in response to teacher feedback.
