Make a mindmap of the different types of family there are (e.g. nuclear, extended). Compare this to your own family.

Create a timeline of education policies from the Tripartite
System (1944) to the Coalition and Conservative policies
(2010-present).

Create an information sheet explaining Marxist, Feminist and Functionalist Perspectives of society.

Research and make notes on how the family has changed since the 1950s. Include your own thoughts on the roles of men and women.

Write a 500-word essay on "What is sociology and why is it important in today's

society?'

Create and a leaflet on how 'childhood' can be seen to be 'toxic' in today's technological world - give examples and suggestions on how to address such issues.

"Toy adverts often show boys with action toys and girls with dolls or kitchen sets. This reinforces gender roles and contributes to inequality."

Provide arguments for and against the statement.

Create an information sheet explaining the meaning of class, gender and ethnicity. How might these factors impact a person's experience of society (include education, family, crime)?

Create a leaflet explaining different types of crime (i.e cybercrime, theft). Include: why does crime happen? What crimes happen most and where? Create your own crime prevention strategies (e.g education and rehabilitation).
