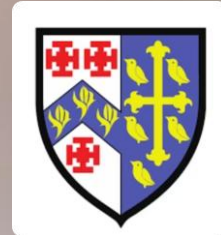

Standards

Compulsory uniform consists of:

Navy Blue Blazer

2

White Shirt

3

Boys Grey Trousers/Girls Navy Trousers

4

Navy Skirt with plain black or navy tights

Pleated knee length or school skirt with badge

5

Year Group Tie

6

Plain Black Shoes

Plain grey, black or navy blue socks



Optional uniform consists of:

Navy blue jumper with or without school badge under blazer
DofE fleece over blazer

SKIRTS

Acceptable Skirts-

navy blue pleated skirt to be worn just above the knee



SKIRTS

Unacceptable Skirts-

bodycon, straight or pencil skirts are not allowed



TROUSERS

Acceptable Trousers- plain straight leg



Boys - Grey School Trousers



Girls - Navy School Trousers

TROUSERS

Unacceptable Trousers-

leggings, flared, skinny, tight fitted, wide leg trousers not allowed



TIGHTS

Tights/Socks-

socks are not to be worn over tights



OUTERWEAR

Acceptable Outerwear- grey, black or navy outdoor coat



OUTERWEAR

Unacceptable Outerwear- lightweight sports jackets/tracksuits tops of any style or colour



SHOES

Acceptable Shoes- plain black leather/leather like or patent shoes



SHOES

Acceptable Shoes-

plain black leather/leather like or patent shoes



SHOES

Unacceptable Footwear-

no crocs, boots, trainers, heels, platform/wedge type or branded foo



Acceptable Piercings-

one pair of gold, silver or pearl studs in the lobe only



Unacceptable Piercings-

no piercings in any other part of the body apart from a pair in the ear lobe



JEWELLERY

Unacceptable Jewellery-

no bracelets, bangles, rings or necklaces



PE Kit

Wearing a PE kit also promotes hygiene, teamwork, discipline, and a sense of belonging within the school.

MAKE UP, NAILS AND HAIR

Make Up

If worn, make up must be subtle in appearance and of a neutral pallet. Extreme contouring and coloured eye make up is not allowed

Nails*-

Nail varnish, press-on, acrylic, full-cover, gel tips (Gel-X), builder hard gel extensions, dip powder, silk or fiberglass wraps are not allowed.

Hair

Hair styles should not have a distinct contrast in length.

Hair that is dyed must be of a natural hair colour and may not contain more than one colour.

To avoid a health and safety risk, long hair must not impede vision or cover the face, except for a fringe which must not cover the eyes. Long hair must be tied up for practical lessons.

Religious head coverings must be black and securely tied for practical lessons.

Hair bands or accessories must be for functional use to secure the hair . Where hairbands are worn they must be black or navy blue.

Headwear that has religious or cultural purpose should be black or navy blue.

The final decision as to whether a student's appearance is appropriate or not rests with the school.
